The kerb space on the eastern side of Kent Street, Sydney between Bathurst Street and Druitt Street, where the changes are proposed, is currently signposted as "1/4P 9am-2.30pm Mon-Fri", "4P Ticket 6-10pm Mon-Fri 8am-10pm Sat-Sun & Public Holidays" and "No Parking 7.30-9am 2.30-6pm Mon-Fri".

Changing the 1/4P restriction to a ticketed loading zone will discourage drivers from over-staying and make it easier for the City's rangers to enforce the restrictions. Increasing the times at which "No Parking" applies will further discourage drivers from over-staying and blocking the pick-up / drop-off area.

Access for service vehicles and deliveries will also be improved.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 55 letters sent out with no responses supporting or opposing the proposal.

St Andrew's Cathedral School has been consulted and supports the parking proposal.

Background

FDC Fitout & Refurbishment (NSW) Pty Ltd has requested a 15 metre long Works Zone in Kent Street, Sydney.

The Works Zone is to facilitate construction works at 1 Market Street, Sydney.

Comments

The kerb space on the western side of Kent Street, Sydney between Market and Druitt Streets where the Works Zone is proposed is currently signposted as "No Stopping". The works zone is proposed within the dedicated left turn lane from Kent Street to Market Street.

The applicant commissioned a traffic assessment to gain an insight into the current traffic conditions in the vicinity of the proposed works zone. The traffic assessment included a queue analysis to determine the extent of queuing in the dedicated left turn lane from Kent Street to Market Street. The traffic assessment was conducted on Wednesday 1 May between 1:45pm and 4:30pm and on Thursday 2 May between 8:30am and 11:30am.

According to the traffic assessment report, the average queue length during the AM peak period was four vehicles and seven vehicles during the PM peak period. However, during the off-peak period, the average queue length was two vehicles. Given that there are only two vehicles queuing on average during the off-peak periods, the queuing vehicles would be contained within the 20 metres "No Stopping" zone at the intersection. Therefore, the proposed Works Zone, which will be located 20 meters from the intersection, should not affect the queuing vehicles at the intersection.

To ensure that the proposed Works Zone does not create traffic impacts at the intersection, the Works Zone is intended to operate only during the off-peak times on weekdays from 9.30am to 3pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 1pm Saturday in accordance with the Complying Development Certificate Conditions. After the Works Zone hours the kerb space will revert to "No Stopping All Other Times".

Consultation

The applicant must notify adjacent properties at least 14 days prior to the implementation of the Works Zone.

Financial

All costs associated with the Works Zone will be borne by the Applicant.

Item 28 Matters Raised

Chairperson

Councillor Chan's office has received representation from a resident regarding the following items. The Representative for the Member for Sydney and Newtown and the Pedestrian Representative also received the correspondence and asked TfNSW for a response to the items.

Automatic Introduction of Pedestrian Crossings

TfNSW asked for a list of specific locations to be provided to them to investigate these locations, and report back to a future Committee meeting.

Countdown Pedestrian Timers

TfNSW will investigate the locations below regarding the installation of pedestrian timers and will report back to a future Committee meeting on the outcome of the investigation.

- Eddy Avenue mid-block crossing
- Oxford Street mid-block crossing (between Brisbane Street and Pelican Street)
- The pedestrian mid-block crossings on the bridges over South Dowling Street, e.g. at Arthur Street, Charles Street and the Light Rail crossing
- The crossing at Taylor Square (Oxford and Flinders Streets), which has an exclusive pedestrian phase despite not being a formal scramble crossing (similar to Elizabeth Street and Market Street in the City, which has countdown timers installed).

Wentworth Avenue Improvements, and Reversal of Other Anti-Pedestrian Changes Made During Light Rail Construction

At the 14 March 2024 meeting, (Item 34), the Representative of Member for Sydney and Newtown requested TfNSW investigate the possibility of removal of the peak "No Stopping 6am-10am, 3pm-8pm Mon-Fri" restriction in Wentworth Avenue due to the implementation of the former CBD Bus corridor improvements. TFNSW advised that they will investigate and update the Committee at a future meeting.

TfNSW advised they will work with the City of Sydney to investigate due to possible changes being implemented with the Elizabeth Cycleway being implemented. An update will be provided at a future Committee meeting.

Light Rail Pedestrian Phasing Opportunities in the CBD

TfNSW advised that along the George Street corridor priority is given to the Light Rail, then to pedestrians and then vehicles.

Missing Pedestrian crossing at East end of Surry Hills Light Rail stop

There is currently a marked pedestrian crossing at the West end of the platform at the Surry Hills Light Rail stop only. When the signalised pedestrian crossing was removed, the pedestrian crossing was just left as it is, with no priority at all for pedestrians.

It would be great to see this converted to a marked raised crossing like at the West end. This would improve safety for passengers accessing the stop from this end towards Crown Street.

TfNSW to investigate and provide an update at a future Committee meeting.

Pedestrian protection at Crown/Cleveland St intersection

At the July 2022 meeting, the Representatives for the Members of Sydney and Newtown raised a concern from residents with the signalised pedestrian crossing at Cleveland Street, Baptist Street and Crown Street intersection. TfNSW advised they were investigating a Pedestrian Protection Phase at this location and said that a further update will be provided at a future Committee meeting.

TfNSW to provide an update on the outcome of the investigation at a future Committee meeting.

Missing Shared Zone signage around Crown Street, Surry Hills

I have noticed that there are a few examples where the signage for shared zones is missing or inadequate at the following locations:

- Crown St entering Collins Street Shared Zone
- Crown Street entering the Arthur St Shared Zone
- Crown St entering Fitzroy St Shared Zone

The City will investigate these locations and arrange for the missing signs to be reinstated.
