BACKGROUND

- 1. On 24 June 2004, the Central Sydney Planning Committee (CSPC) delegated authority to the City of Sydney for the determination of development applications involving variation to a development standard (SEPP1 variations) and costing less than \$50 million. A report to the CSPC on the applications determined under the delegation is required on a minimum six-monthly basis. As the Department of Planning also requires a report of applications determined with variations to development standards on a quarterly basis, the report to the CSPC is scheduled to be submitted to the CSPC meeting following the end of each reporting period.
- 2. Seventeen applications were approved under delegation of the CSPC involving variation to a development standard during the period 1 April to 30 June 2012. Details of the applications determined during this period are in the table in Attachment A.
- 3. Fifteen of the 17 applications approved with SEPP1 variations in the quarter were located in Glebe or Forest Lodge, with one each in Pyrmont and Waterloo. Ninety-four per cent related to residential alterations and additions for floor space ratio or landscaping variations to the controls.
