BACKGROUND

- 1. On 24 June 2004, the Central Sydney Planning Committee (CSPC) delegated authority to the City of Sydney for the determination of development applications involving variation to a development standard and costing less than \$50 million. A report to the CSPC on the applications determined under the delegation is required on a minimum six-monthly basis. In accordance with the reporting requirements prescribed in the Planning Circular PS08-014 issued by the NSW Department of Planning, a quarterly report is being submitted to the CSPC.
- 2. For applications lodged after the adoption of the Sydney Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2012 on 14 December 2012, SEPP1 no longer applies in the City of Sydney (except to the land within the City of Sydney that the Sydney LEP 2012 does not currently apply). Local environmental plans made in the standard instrument format such as the Sydney LEP 2012, Clause 4.6 variations replace the provisions of SEPP1 where a variation to be a development standard is sought. Variations under both SEPP1 and Clause 4.6 will continue to be reported to the CSPC.
- 3. Twenty-two (22) applications were approved where there has been a variation to a development standard during the period 1 October 2013 to 31 December 2013. Details of the applications reported are in the table in Attachment A.
