South opens 4H, all pass. West leads the SQ: king - ace - four. What do you play at trick 2?

As dummy has the HA-Q, you presume South has very long hearts. Always count the tricks for your side. With two in spades (you hope) and at most one in diamonds, where is the fourth trick?

After South opened 4H, all pass, Dave Beauchamp led the SQ, king, ace. Matthew Thomson (E) returned the S7, winning. The club switch, too late, went to the king and ace. Tony Nunn, South, played the DK. West won, but South could win the heart switch and pitch the club loser on the DQ, North-South +620.

With no trump trick feasible, the defence has find a club trick, the only hope of beating 4H. East must play South to hold two clubs and switch to a low club at trick 2. After CK, CA, and the DK, West wins and must return the S2, hoping that East can win and cash a club.

West led the SQ, king, ace, and East should have returned a spade. A club switch would have worked, but that is too tough and not necessary against 5H. A club switch would allow 5H to succeed if South's pattern was 2-8-3-0.

When East switched to the D8, West took the DA and could have cashed a spade. The diamond shift was so unusual, that West expected East to have six spades and one diamond. That would give South a 1-8-3-1 pattern, certainly a possibility. West returned a diamond and South could pitch both black-suit losers, North-South +650 and +1 Imp.

With neither side vulnerable, East opens 1C (artificial, 15+ points). What action would you take with:

Notice of Acceptance of an Enforceable Undertaking under Part 11 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011

On 20 March 2014, a worker employed by a transport company was fatally injured when he was struck by a moonbuggy at Brighann Ginning's Watercourse Road premises in Moree NSW.

The WorkCover Authority of NSW (now SafeWork NSW) investigated the incident and subsequently alleged that William John Seery contravened Sections 19(1) and 32 of the Work Health and Safety Act 2011.

This notice has been placed under the terms of an enforceable undertaking and acknowledges acceptance of an undertaking, that is enforceable under the Act, from William John Seery as settlement of the above-mentioned alleged contravention.

The undertaking requires the following actions:

- Develop and implement a Safety Culture Enhancement Program
- Develop and implement a Due Diligence Program
- Refine traffic management processes
- Build a seed truck catwalk
- Produce industry specific safety awareness videos
- Conduct a presentation to industry on the incident
- Promote and conduct a fatigue management and safety awareness campaign
