# Public Notice

## Proposed Alcohol-Free Zones and Alcohol Prohibited Areas in the City of Sydney

Alcohol restrictions aim to prevent antisocial behaviour by prohibiting the consumption of alcohol in public spaces. Alcohol-free zones apply to streets. Alcohol prohibited areas apply to parks and other public places.

NSW Police are responsible for enforcing alcohol-free zones and alcohol prohibited areas in the city. People found to be drinking within a designated alcohol-free zone or alcohol prohibited area can have their alcohol confiscated by the police.
