ITEM 6. STREET EVENTS – TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES – SYDNEY RUNNING FESTIVAL 2015

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the following:

- (A) The temporary road closures of various streets in Pyrmont, Millers Point, central Sydney, Darlinghurst, Surry Hills and Moore Park for the Sydney Running Festival Course Event on Sunday 20 September 2015.
- (B) The Applicant must comply with the temporary road closures conditions as stipulated in Schedule B of this Agenda.
- (C) The Applicant must contact the Sydney City Police to discuss deployment of user pay police for the event.
- (D) The Applicant must contact the City's Venue Management Unit to discuss the event.
- (E) The Applicant shall submit a traffic management plan for approval by Roads and Maritime Services, Sydney Buses, Police and Council.
- (F) The Applicant shall submit the final approved traffic management plan to Road and Maritime Services and Council 6 weeks prior to the event.
- (G) The Applicant must contact Roads and Maritime Services to discuss Special Event Clearways for the event.
- (H) The Applicant must provide a telephone number of the supervisor responsible for the proposed event and include contact details in the notification letters to be distributed to affected stakeholders.
- (I) The Applicant must contact Sydney Buses and arrange and pay for the rerouting of bus services around the closures, the temporary relocation of bus stops and any additional staff required.

DECISION

BACKGROUND

Event & Sports Projects Australia Pty Ltd (ESPA) on behalf of Pont 3 Pty Ltd (the Event Organiser) has applied for temporary road closures for the Sydney Running Festival on Sunday 20 September 2015.

The Sydney Running Festival is one of the highlights of Australia's running calendar and is expected to attract over 35,000 participants from across NSW, interstate and overseas. The Festival will showcase Sydney's many landmarks and attractions around Sydney Harbour, Botanic Gardens, Centennial Park and the Opera House.

There are various streets closures in Pyrmont, Millers Point, central Sydney, Botanic Gardens, Darlinghurst, Surry Hills, Moore Park and Centennial Park.

COMMENTS

The Sydney Running Festival courses start at Milsons Point adjacent to Bradfield Park and finishes in the Sydney Opera House Forecourt.

The Department of Premiers and Cabinet has granted "Hallmark Event" status for the Sydney Running Festival. The Hallmark status gives full exemption from user's charges of the NSW Police, Roads and Maritime Services and Ambulance services.

The Sydney Running Festival 2015 event has four races within the event to cater for all sections of the community.

The four races area as follows:

Sydney Half Marathon (21.1 km) starts at 6.15am and has 3 hours total time allowed for event (approximately 8,000 runners), finishing at the Opera House.

Sydney Marathon including wheelchairs (42.2 km) starts 7.15am and has 5 hours and 30 minutes total time allowed for the event (approximately 5,000 runners), finishing at the Opera House.

The Family Fun Run (4.4km) starts at 7.55am and has 1 hour and 30 Minutes total time allowed for the event and this year will finish at the Opera House.

Bridge Run (9 km) starts at 9am and has 2 hours total time allowed for the event, finishing at the Conservatorium of Music.

The Family Fun Run and the Bridge Run have a combined number of participants of approximately 20,000 people.

This endorsement provides public liability cover to the organisers, participants, volunteers, landowners and other interested parties. There have been numerous coordination meetings held at the Department of Premiers and Cabinet with the Protocol and Special Events Group which has representatives from various authorities, organisation and emergency services that assist with managing the marathon event.

CONSULTATION

The Applicant will be required to notify affected residents and stakeholders as stipulated in Schedule B.

The applicant will be undertaking newspaper and radio advertising. There will be a website available with details on the event, transport arrangements and entry details. A letter box drop will carried out along the entire course advising of the event and parking restrictions.

FINANCIAL

All costs for the event will be borne by the various Authorities and the Applicant for the bump-in/bump-out of barriers etc and cleansing.
