

ITEM 4. STREET EVENT – 2016 ANZAC DAY MARCH

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the temporary road closures associated with the Anzac Day March on Monday 25 April 2016 subject to the following conditions:-

- (A) The Applicant must comply with the temporary road closure conditions as stipulated in Schedule B of this agenda;
- (B) The Applicant must contact the Sydney City Police to discuss deployment of user pay police for the event;
- (C) The Applicant must seek separate approval from the City's Venue Management Unit for the event in Martin Place;
- (D) The Applicant is to obtain a Road Occupancy Licence from the Transport Management Centre prior to commencement of works;
- (E) The Applicant must prepare traffic management and control plans for the event; and
- (F) The Applicant must provide a telephone number of the supervisor responsible for the proposed event and include contact details in the notification letters to be distributed to affected stakeholders.

DECISION

BACKGROUND

The Returned and Services League of Australia (NSW Branch) has applied for temporary road closures associated with the Anzac Day March in Sydney CBD on Monday 25 April 2016.

COMMENTS

The NSW Department of Premiers and Cabinet coordinate meetings between Transport Authorities (RMS, Sydney Buses, Sydney Trains, and Transport for NSW), Emergency Services, Councils, NSW Taxi Council and Event organisers to plan for the Annual

Anzac Day March.

Since the Anzac Day March in 2015, there have been significant changes to the road network in central Sydney, especially the CBD.

The new bus arrangements were installed in October 2015 which removed all bus services off George Street ready for construction of the new CBD and South East Light Rail.

Major sections of George Street have been closed to through traffic (Park Street to King Street) and more sections of roads will be closed this year.

The Anzac Day March route will now start in Martin Place, travel south on Elizabeth Street, east in Liverpool Street and finish in Hyde Park South.

Temporary Road Closures – Monday 25 April 2015

3am to 6am

Castlereagh Street from Hunter Street to King Street;
Elizabeth Street from Hunter Street to Market Street;
Phillip Street from Hunter Street to King Street; and
Pitt Street from Hunter Street to King Street.

6am to 8.30am

Abercrombie Street from O'Connor Street to Broadway (2 lanes).

6am to 1.30pm

Hunter Street from Macquarie Street to George Street.

6am to 4pm

Bathurst Street from Harbour Street to Sussex Street;
Bathurst Street from Pitt Street to Elizabeth Street;
Bent Street from Macquarie Street to Gresham/Spring Streets;
Bligh Street from Bent Street to Hunter Street;

St James Road from Macquarie Street to Elizabeth Street.

Special Event Clearways – Monday 25 April 2016

Transport for NSW and RMS will organise Special Events Clearways for temporary road closure streets and other major road corridors to assist public transport and general traffic movements around the Anzac Day March route.

Assembly Area

Assembly points for participants will be in King Street (George Street to Castlereagh Street); Pitt Street (King Street to Spring Street); Castlereagh Street (Martin Place to Hunter Street); Spring Street (Gresham Street to Pitt Street); Bent Street (Gresham Street to Phillip Street); O'Connell Street (Hunter Street to Bent Street); Bligh Street (Hunter Street to Bent Street); Phillip Street (Hunter Street to Bent Street); Elizabeth Street (Hunter Street to Martin Place); Phillip Street (At Hunter Street) and Hunter Street (Macquarie Street to Pitt Street).

Route and Time of Event

The event will commence at 9am with participants walking along Pitt Street, through Martin Place and then move south on Elizabeth Street, left into Liverpool Street and finish in Hyde Park South at 1pm at the War Memorial for a Commemoration Service.

There are a number of smaller service unit commemorative marches that will take place both prior to and after the main Anzac Day March, but conflict between these events will not occur.

There are currently no other approved temporary road closures proposed to take place on the same day.

CONSULTATION

The Applicant will be required to notify affected stakeholders as stipulated in Schedule B.

FINANCIAL

Not applicable as Anzac Day is a national day of remembrance which is exempt from fees as stipulated in the current Fees and Charges.
