It is recommended that the Committee endorse the reallocation of parking on the western side of Shepherd Street, Darlington between the points 66.6 metres and 77.8 metres (two car spaces) south of Cleveland Street as "2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Excepted Area 32".

DECISION

BACKGROUND

A resident of Shepherd Street has requested consideration of additional permit parking Shepherd Street to provide additional availability of parking spaces for residents.

There is an existing "No Parking" zone on the western side of Shepherd Street which is redundant. On-site inspections show that there is an opportunity to provide additional parking in this location.

COMMENTS

Part of the kerb space on the western side of Shepherd Street, Darlington south of the driveway to the Shepherd Street Car Park is currently signposted as "No Parking" to provide for set-down at the car park.

The "No Parking" restriction is no longer being used and is not required. On-site inspection shows there is an opportunity to provide timed permit parking on the western side of Shepherd Street to increase parking turnover and improve resident access to on-street parking.

The provision of "2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Excepted Area 32" in this location would be consistent with the parking restrictions on the eastern side of Shepherd Street.

The proposed changes would limit any vehicle which does not have a permit to two (2) hours of parking from 8am to 10pm seven days a week where the signs are installed.

Residents with an Area 32 parking permit will be exempt from the two-hour time limit.

A two-hour parking limit is preferred for streets in the inner residential areas as it better balances the long-stay parking needs of permit holders with the needs of all households to use parking for visitors, family, carers and tradespeople.

CONSULTATION

The City has not consulted residents and businesses as the proposal is removing a redundant restriction and is not reducing the existing number of parking spaces in the area.


FINANCIAL
