#### DECISION

#### BACKGROUND

A resident of Wilson Street has requested consideration of a "No Parking" restriction in Wilson Lane to ensure unobstructed access to their rear off-street parking.

#### COMMENTS

A section of the kerb space on the southern side of Wilson Lane, Newtown between Randle Street and Holdsworth Lane is currently unrestricted for parking.

Wilson Lane is approximately 5 metres wide and provides rear-lane property access to houses fronting Wilson Street.

Under existing conditions, when a vehicle parks in Wilson Lane the two-way traffic flow is reduced to a single lane. This restricts rear-lane property access.

The NSW Road Rules prohibit drivers from parking at any time across a driveway, or in any other way which blocks access to a driveway. Section 6 of the Roads Act 1993 gives adjoining land owners a right of vehicle access to the public road. Complying with this legislation sometimes results in the loss of on-street parking.

On-site inspection shows there is a need to provide a 'No Parking' restriction to maintain rear-lane property access.

#### CONSULTATION

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 43 letters sent out with no responses supporting or opposing the proposal.


#### FINANCIAL
