### **DECISION**

# **BACKGROUND**

The Development Consent for 84-92 Epsom Road, Zetland (D/2014/1928) requires the Applicant to extend the existing raised median in Epsom Road east to restrict vehicular access into Fuse Street, a new two-way road within the Epsom Park Precinct, to left-in/left-out movements only.

The delivery of the median extension will address Consent Conditions 47 and 48 for 84-92 Epsom Road, Zetland and must be constructed prior to any Occupation Certificate being issued for the redevelopment.

# **COMMENTS**

The Epsom Park Precinct, bounded by Victoria Park, South Dowling Street, Epsom Road and Joynton Avenue, forms part of the Green Square urban renewal area and will include a new two-way north-south aligned road connecting Epsom Road with the soon-to-be completed Rose Valley Way. The road, known as "Fuse Street", will provide future vehicular access to 84-92 Epsom Road and will be delivered as a Shared Zone.

The Development Consent for 84-92 Epsom Road, Zetland (D/2014/1928) requires the Applicant to extend the existing raised median in Epsom Road further east to:

- limit vehicular access into and out of Fuse Street to left-in/left-out movements only;
   and
- limit vehicular access to the westernmost driveway to 1-3 Rosebery Avenue, just east
  of Spring Street and fronting the southern kerb of Epsom Road, to left-in/left-out
  movements only.

Please note that the easternmost driveways to 1-3 Rosebery Avenue fronting Epsom Road will remain unaffected by the proposal.

From a road safety perspective, the proposed median is beneficial as it would reduce the number of vehicle conflicts at the future intersection of Epsom Road and Fuse Street. The proposal would also be beneficial from a network efficiency perspective, particularly for bus services using Epsom Road, as it would remove delays associated with right-turning vehicles into Fuse Street.

Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) approved a Traffic Management Plan (TMP) for the proposed median on 19 January 2017.

# **CONSULTATION**

In compliance with Section 116 of the *Roads Act 1993*, the City consulted with local residents and businesses for a period of 28 days and advertised the proposal in The Sydney Morning Herald and the Central Sydney Magazine.

In March 2017, the City consulted with 191 properties via letterbox drop requesting feedback on the proposed median. A total of three submissions were received with two responses supporting the proposal and one response opposing the proposal.

Submissions supporting the proposal believed it would considerably improve safety on Epsom Road.

The submission opposing the median believed it would restrict vehicular access to Rosebery Avenue from Epsom Road. Given that the proposal will not impact vehicular access at the intersection of Epsom Road and Rosebery Avenue, combined with the safety and network efficiency benefits, it is recommended the proposal be endorsed by the Committee.


