## RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the following in Catherine Street, Glebe:

- (A) Three 2.6 metre wide kerb islands with tree planting on the northern side of Catherine Street, between Westmoreland and Derwent Streets;
- (B) Eight 2.6 metre wide kerb islands with tree planting on the southern side of Catherine Street, between Mount Vernon and Derwent Streets; and
- (C) Reallocation of parking on the northern side of Catherine Street, between the points 10 metres and 28 metres (three car spaces) west of Westmoreland Street as "2P 8am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area G".

# DECISION

# BACKGROUND

The City's Sustainable Sydney 2030 vision includes commitments to increase tree canopy cover by 50% by 2030, to green our City and improve the amenity of our streets.

In 2011 Council adopted the City's Street Tree Master Plan which identifies a range of inroad tree planting sites including Catherine Street, Glebe.

## COMMENTS

The carriageway of Catherine Street, Glebe, is 12.8 metres wide, kerb-to-kerb.

The proposal to install a total of 11 2.6 metre wide kerb islands on both sides of Catherine Street, between Mount Vernon and Derwent Streets, would help improve general safety in the area by reducing the speed of traffic traveling along Catherine Street.

The proposal will ensure 3.5 metre wide travel lanes in each direction and maintain existing local and bus access.

The installation of the kerb islands will remove six parking spaces and the reallocation of kerb space on the northern side of Catherine Street, between Westmoreland Street and Mount Vernon Lane, from No Stopping to 2P permit parking will gain three parking spaces – the proposal will result in a loss of three parking spaces.

# CONSULTATION

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 213 letters sent out with five responses supporting the proposal and no responses opposing the proposal.

The responses supported increasing tree planting in Catherine Street to improve residential amenity.

## FINANCIAL

Funds are available in the current capital works budget.
