DECISION

The Committee carried the recommendation unanimously out-of-session on 10 January 2018.

BACKGROUND

The Sydney Metro City and Southwest is an approved Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) project and includes the delivery of the Barangaroo Metro Station in Hickson Road, Barangaroo. The tunnelling and station excavation works for the Barangaroo Metro Station requires the removal and relocation of Bus Stops in Hickson Road, south of the Munn Street overbridge – adjacent to the Nawi Square Lawn.

On 18 October 2017, the Committee endorsed the temporary removal of parking in Hickson Road, Barangaroo, between the marked pedestrian crossing north of the High Street Stairs and the Windmill Street Overpass (133 parking spaces) for the duration of the construction of Barangaroo Metro Station.

On 19 December 2017, the Committee endorsed out-of-session traffic changes in Hickson Road, Barangaroo, for works associated with the tunnelling and station excavation works for the Barangaroo Metro Station.

DECISION

The Committee carried the recommendation unanimously out-of-session on 19 December 2017.

BACKGROUND

Barangaroo is a major urban renewal precinct on the western harbour edge of the Sydney CBD. The southern part of the precinct is currently the workplace of approximately 25,000 people every day as well as both local and international visitors for food and beverage, events, and retail experiences. The Barangaroo Reserve to the north of the precinct is a major destination for visitors and locals, and is generally accessed by foot and public transport.

While the precinct has an operational function, there are still a number of significant construction activities occurring, including the upgrade of Hickson Road between the Sussex Hotel (opposite Shelley Street) and Watermans Quay, and the Hickson Road remediation works immediately north of Watermans Quay. These construction activities have resulted in a dynamic pedestrian environment where changes to infrastructure on a temporary basis has affected pedestrian desire lines and behaviour.

BACKGROUND

The Sydney Metro City and Southwest is an approved Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) project and includes the delivery of a station at Barangaroo in Hickson Road. The method of construction is a cut and cover box which sits in Hickson Road and takes the entire width of the road for a length of approximately 210 metres (between the High Street Steps and 25 Hickson Road).

There is an existing pedestrian crossing on Hickson Road located approximately 290 metres north of the northern kerb of Watermans Quay. This pedestrian crossing is currently within the area that is to be excavated by Metro for the station box from January 2018. It is proposed that the crossing is relocated approximately 20 metres to the south of its current location as a critical part of the Metro Stage 3 works at Barangaroo.

DECISION

The Committee carried the recommendation unanimously.

BACKGROUND

The City's Sustainable Sydney 2030 vision includes commitments to increase tree canopy cover by 50% by 2030, to green our City and improve the amenity of our streets. In 2011, Council adopted the City's Street Tree Master Plan which identifies a range of 'In-Road' tree planting sites, such as Primrose Avenue, Rosebery between Harcourt Parade and Gardeners Road.

The garden bed median with 'In-Road' trees on Primrose Avenue will present a valuable opportunity to increase tree canopy in the street as well as increasing safety by visually narrowing the street to reduce vehicle speeds. The median will also facilitate the provision of pedestrian refuges at intersections reducing the distance a pedestrian needs to cross the road.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the installation of the following treatments in Sonny Leonard and Hinchcliffe Streets, Zetland (i.e. new roads) between Paul Street and Geddes Avenue:

Sonny Leonard Street, Zetland:

Provision of a raised pedestrian crossing, between the points 68.6 metres and 75.2 metres west of Paul Street;

- (A) Provision of two speed cushions, between the points 107.2 metres and 109 metres west of Paul Street;
- (B) Northern side, between the points 0 metres and 19.8 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (C) Northern side, between the points 19.8 metres and 30.1 metres (two car spaces) west of Paul Street, as "No Parking" for future car share spaces;
- (D) Northern side, between the points 30.1 metres and 42.8 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (E) Northern side, between the points 42.8 metres and 60.8 metres (three car spaces) west of Paul Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (F) Northern side, between the points 60.8 metres and 81.2 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (G) Northern side, between the points 81.2 metres and 98.7 metres (three car spaces) west of Paul Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (H) Northern side, between the points 98.7 metres and 123.8 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (I) Southern side, between the points 0 metres and 14.4 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (J) Southern side, between the points 14.4 metres and 22.2 metres (one car space) west of Paul Street, as "Disability Parking";
- (K) Southern side, between the points 22.2 metres and 28.2 metres (one car space) west of Paul Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (L) Southern side, between the points 28.2 metres and 37.8 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (M) Southern side, between the points 37.8 metres and 54.8 metres (three car spaces) west of Paul Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (N) Southern side, between the points 54.8 metres and 79.7 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;

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- (O) Southern side, between the points 79.7 metres and 91.7 metres (two car spaces) west of Paul Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (P) Southern side, between the points 91.7 metres and 95 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (Q) Southern side, between the points 95 metres and 107 metres (two car spaces) west of Paul Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (R) Southern side, between the points 107 metres and 123.8 metres west of Paul Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;

Hinchcliffe Street, Zetland:

- (A) Provision of two speed cushions, between points 5.6 metres and 7.4 metres north of Sonny Leonard Street;
- (B) Western side, between the points 0 metres and 5.6 metres north of Sonny Leonard Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (C) Western side, between the points 5.6 metres and 17.9 metres (two car spaces) north of Sonny Leonard Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm";
- (D) Western side, between the points 17.9 metres and 34.2 metres, north of Sonny Leonard Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (E) Eastern side, between the points 0 metres and 5.6 metres north of Sonny Leonard Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line;
- (F) Eastern side, between the points 5.6 metres and 17.6 metres (two car spaces) north of Sonny Leonard Street, as "2P Ticket 8am-10pm"; and
- (G) Eastern side, between the points 17.6 metres and 34.2 metres north of Sonny Leonard Street, marked with a yellow "No Stopping" line.

DECISION

The Committee carried the recommendation unanimously.

BACKGROUND

The Development Consent for 511 Botany Road, Zetland (D/2013/1947) requires the Applicant to deliver additional sections of Sonny Leonard and Hinchcliffe Streets adjacent to the development site.

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The new section of Sonny Leonard Street is located west of Paul Street and connects to a new section of Hinchcliffe Street north of Sonny Leonard Street. At the completion of the works, the new roads will be dedicated to the City.

The delivery of the new roads will address Condition 95(a) for 511 Botany Road, Zetland. In addition, Condition 34 requires the Applicant to submit a signage plan for kerbside parking and line marking arrangements that is to be referred to the Local Pedestrian, Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee, as part of the dedication of Sonny Leonard Street and Hinchcliffe Street as a public road.
