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Structure and Operation of the Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee

- 1. The views expressed in this document are those of the Committee members, not necessarily the views of the City of Sydney Council.
- 2. The Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee in not a committee of the City of Sydney Council, but a Committee of the Roads and Maritime Services.
- 3. Council has been delegated certain powers from the Roads and Maritime Services with regards to traffic matters on local roads. A condition of this delegation is that Council must take into account the advice of the Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee.
- 4. The Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee has no decision- making powers. It is primarily a technical review body which is required to advise Council on traffic related matters.
- 5. All proposals recommended by the Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee must still be formally approved by either the elected Council or authorised Council staff (depending on the nature of the proposal). This can only be done when the advice of the Committee is unanimous. Where the advice of the Committee is not unanimous, Council must separately notify and obtain endorsement from the Roads and Maritime Services and the NSW Police.
- 6. There are four formal members of the Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee each with a single vote: the City of Sydney, the Roads and Maritime Services, the NSW Police and the local State Members of Parliament or their nominee (who can only vote on issues in their electorate). There are also informal (non-voting) advisors who may attend.
- 7. The Lord Mayor is Chairperson of the Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee or in the Lord Mayor's absence, the Deputy Chairperson, who is a nominated Councillor.
- 8. Members of the public are welcome to attend and speak to an item on the Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee agenda. Addresses to the Committee are limited to 3 minutes, but this can be extended at the discretion of the Chairperson. If a member of the public wishes to attend, it is requested that they inform the Committee Secretary in advance on 9265 9648.
- 9. The Local Pedestrian Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee meet every third Thursday of the month at 10am in the Council Chamber, Level 1, Town Hall, 483 George Street, Sydney.







The Development Consents for 713-717 Elizabeth Street, Waterloo (D/2014/1300/A) and 707-711 Elizabeth Street, Waterloo (D/2016/135/A) requires the Applicants to submit proposed parking changes for consideration.

The construction of the two sites have required the temporary relocation of bus stops to minimise the impact on construction on regular bus services. As construction is nearing

completion, parking on the western side of Elizabeth Street needs to be updated to reflect the new land use and to return the bus stops to the proper locations.

Comments

The City has approved the redevelopment of 713-717 and 707-711 Elizabeth Street, Waterloo, which requires the consideration of amended parking restrictions along the site frontage.

The kerb space on the western side of Elizabeth Street, Waterloo, where the changes are proposed, is currently a mix of Bus Zone, No Parking and unrestricted parking restrictions. A No Stopping restriction is also in operation during peak hours, from 7.30am-9am and 5pm-6pm on weekdays, south of the temporary Bus Zone restriction.

The proposed changes facilitate the removal of a 'No Parking' restriction (former driveway location) and the temporary bus stop outside 713-717 Elizabeth Street and replacing them with two-hour timed parking during weekdays outside of the peak hour restrictions.

The proposed changes would limit any vehicle to two hours between 9am and 4pm on weekdays to improve turnover of parking for visitors to the adjacent properties. The existing 'No Stopping' restriction in place between 7.30am-9am and 4pm-6pm on weekdays will be retained. The kerb space is proposed to be unrestricted for parking outside of these times.

State Transit has advised they have no objection to the proposed changes.



A resident of Newton Street, Alexandria has requested a disability parking space in the street. The resident has advised they are not in a wheelchair but cannot physically walk far.

Comments

Newton Street, Alexandria between Henderson Lane and Copeland Lane is designated for two-way traffic flow with an approximate width of 10.1 metres.

The kerb space, where the changes are proposed, is currently signposted as "2P 8am-6pm Mon-Fri (Permit Holders Excepted Area 36).

Under existing conditions, vehicles park on both sides of the street, which reduces the trafficable lane for two-way traffic flow to an approximate width of 6.5 metres. The remaining width is allocated for on-street parking.

Footpaths (approximately 2.6 metres wide) are provided on both sides of the street.

The Australian Standard for on-street disability parking (AS 2890.5 – 1993) requires spaces to be 6.7 metres long and 3.2 metres wide for middle spaces.

A 6.7 metre long bay is proposed and with consideration for the width of existing parking lane in Newton Street, a 3.2 metre wide bay can be accommodated within the carriageway.

Although the resident is not wheelchair-bound and kerb ramps are not necessary, the City will investigate installing ramps at this site should the proposal be endorsed.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 173 letters sent out with no responses supporting or opposing the proposal.

Background

The City in April 2018, consulted on the Alexandria Local Area Traffic Management Plan, which recommended several traffic calming treatments to mitigate the impacts of WestConnex on local roads.

The footpath widening in Wyndham Street is proposed to make it safer for people walking crossing Wyndham Street to get to Power Avenue and Alexandria Park and vice versa.

The footpath widening will provide a combined ramp, which provides access for both pedestrians and the adjacent residential vehicle driveway. Tactile markers and line marking will be installed on the footpath widening to delineate between the area for pedestrians compared to the single vehicle access.

Comments

In April 2018 we developed a local area traffic management (LATM) plan for Alexandria, Erskineville and St Peters. The LATM Plan proposed a suite of treatments and streetscape improvements to:

- Protect local amenity and maintain property access;
- Apply a precinct-wide approach to ensure the problem is tackled collectively rather than street by street; and
- Consider the impact on pedestrians and cyclists as well as vehicles.

The City consulted with the local community to gather their feedback on the proposed suite of treatments from April 2018 to June 2018. At the end of the consultation period the City received 731 submissions with 75% of the submissions received supporting the City's LATM plan.

The City is now progressing on the approval of several of these treatments, including the continuous footpath treatment (CFT) on Power Avenue at Wyndham Street. This treatment has recently been constructed.

While constructing the CFT in Power Avenue at Wyndham Street, the City saw the opportunity to improve pedestrian access across Wyndham Street from Power Avenue (and Alexandria Park) to the opposite side of the road by simply providing a small footpath widening opposite.

This footpath widening along the eastern side of Wyndham Street opposite Power Avenue will assist pedestrians by shortening the distance to cross the road and improve sighting and safety.

This proposal will require the loss of one parking space.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 183 letters sent out with two submissions received in support and none against the proposed footpath widening on Wyndham Street.

The comments received during the Public Consultation are examined and reviewed to determine how a proposal progresses or is modified to address community comments.

In this case, the City intends to proceed with the proposed footpath widening.

There were a few comments raised during the community consultation and the City's responses are shown as follows:

Comment: Concern with access to two driveways by vehicle including trucks at footpath widening location.

 Answer: The City will review footpath widening design to ensure vehicle access is maintained.

Comment: Additional measures to be untaken to improve pedestrian, cyclist and vehicle safety along Wyndham Street.

• **Answer:** The City will review arrangements along Wyndham Street to ensure safety is maintained for all road users.

Comment: Sign post the pedestrian crossing associated with the footpath widening to warn motorists to reduce speed.

 Answer: There is no marked pedestrian crossing associated with the footpath widening works. However, City will inspect the location to ensure sight lines for pedestrians and motorists are not obstructed.

Comment: Provide a marked pedestrian crossing for access to Alexandria Community Park school.

• **Answer:** At this stage, a marked pedestrian crossing will not be provided. However the City will investigate further to see if a crossing could be provided in future.

Comment: Reduce Wyndham Street speed limit to 40km/hr.

 Answer: Transport for NSW control speed limits in NSW and the City has no authority to change the existing speed limit.



Background

The City received a request to provide facilities for pedestrians and in particularly pedestrians with children, crossing Coulson Street, Erskineville at Eve Street.

Comments

The raised pedestrian crossing will include wider footpaths to reduce vehicle speeds and increase visibility adjacent to the proposed crossing. The proposal will help improve general safety in the area as part of the City's commitment to calm traffic and improve residential amenity.

Given that Coulson Street is on a bus route, the raised crossing will comply with STA guidelines. Additionally, the footpath widening at the raised crossing will maintain the existing travel lane widths along Coulson Street so that it does not affect flow along the street.

In July 2018, the Committee endorsed a proposal to replace the existing raised threshold on Eve Street just north of Coulson Street with a continuous footpath treatment. The proposed pedestrian crossing across Coulson Street would be completed as part of these intersection improvements.

To meet the TfNSW warrants for a pedestrian crossing, the proposed location must record pedestrian and traffic flows of equal to or greater than, 30 pedestrians (P) and 500 vehicles (V) per hour for three one-hour periods in a day, and where P x V is also greater than or equal to 60,000.

The TfNSW reduced pedestrian crossing warrant is for volumes greater than 200 vehicles and 30 pedestrians per hour for two one-hour periods on a typical day, and where the proposed crossing is to be used by a high proportion of children or elderly pedestrians.

Pedestrian and vehicle counts have been carried out at this location as follows: -

Time	Vehicles (V)	Pedestrians (P)	P x V (>60,000)
8am-9am	319	49	15,631
11am-12pm	247	32	7,904
3pm-4pm	279	25	6,975

The TfNSW warrant for a marked pedestrian crossing was not satisfied, however as the crossing provides a missing connection which would improve safety and reduce vehicle

speeds between a large residential complex, Sydney Park Village and Erskineville village, Erskineville Public School and Railway Station, TfNSW raised no objection to the proposal.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 1877 letters sent out with 48 responses supporting the proposal and nine responses opposing the proposal.

The responses supporting the proposal noted that the crossing would increase safety, particularly for children walking to school and also noted the proposal would reduce vehicle speeds on Coulson Street.

The responses opposing the proposal noted that the crossing would increase congestion, particularly for drivers turning from Eve Street to Coulson Street who might have to stop twice for the same pedestrian to cross and requested the crossing was located west of Eve Street.

However, if the crossing was moved to the western side of Eve Street, adequate disability access cannot be provided without requiring well-established trees to be removed, increasing the amount of parking to be removed and the relocation of an Ausgrid electricity pole onto a section of narrow footpath on Coulson Street. This would have a greater impact on the community.

Responses opposing the proposal also noted that the crossing would require the removal of car parking spaces.

Demand for parking in the city is far greater than the available spaces. As such, any loss of parking is minimised when implementing infrastructure to achieve safer walkable environments. Drivers are normally required not to park within 20 metres of a pedestrian crossing, however as wider footpaths (2.5 metres wide) are being provided, parking is also permitted to be retained closer to the crossing (ie 7 metres). This would still improve visibility between drivers and pedestrians at the crossing.

A response also noted that providing a raised the pedestrian crossing at the intersection would facilitate vehicles mounting the kerb to travel on the footpath at the corner of the intersection.

While the NSW Road Rules do not permit vehicles travelling on the footpath, the crossing will be constructed with additional landscaping and clear contrast between the road environment and the footpath. Given that the proposed pedestrian crossing would slow vehicle speeds, increase safety and promote pedestrian priority at the intersection, it is proposed to proceed with the proposal.



Background

The City in April 2018, consulted on the Alexandria Local Area Traffic Management Plan, which recommended a number of traffic calming treatments to mitigate the impacts of WestConnex on local roads.

The Lawrence Street and Belmont Street single lane slow points between Harley and Fountain Streets were recommended treatments to make it safer for people walking in the area and increase open space in Alexandria.

Comments

In April 2018 we developed a local area traffic management (LATM) plan for Alexandria, Erskineville and St Peters. The LATM Plan proposed a suite of treatments and streetscape improvements to:

- Protect local amenity and maintain property access;
- Apply a precinct-wide approach to ensure the problem is tackled collectively rather than street by street; and
- Consider the impact on pedestrians and cyclists as well as vehicles.

The City consulted with the local community to gather their feedback on the proposed suite of treatments from April 2018 to June 2018. At the end of the consultation period the City received 731 submissions with 75% of the submissions received supporting the City's LATM plan.

The City is now progressing on the approval of several of these treatments, including the single lane slow points on Lawrence Street and Belmont Street mid-way between Harley and Fountain Streets.

A single lane slow point treatment will only allow one vehicle to pass in a short narrow section of road, at low speed, one at a time while opposing vehicles will have to wait their turn to pass. The treatment will be created by footpath widening with landscaping to maintain residential amenity. Parking will not be affected as the slow point treatments will replace existing at-grade thresholds that already include kerb side islands and a median.

The slow point will protect local amenity, improved pedestrian and cyclist's safety by reducing vehicle speeds and discourage by-pass traffic.

Consultation

The City distributed 349 letters to residents and businesses in the area and received a total of 23 submissions with 16 in support and 7 against the proposed single lane slow points on Lawrence Street and Belmont Street.

The comments received during the Public Consultation are examined and reviewed to determine how a proposal progresses or is modified to address community comments.

In this case, given the need to protect these local streets prior to the opening of the St Peter Interchange, the City intends to proceed with the proposed single lane slow points.

There were several comments raised during the community consultation and the City's responses are shown as follows:

Comment: Concerns with safety on a single lane two-way flow operation at night.

 Answer: The single lane slow points will have reflective signage and street lighting with speed hump road markings to highlight the traffic treatment.

Comment: Slow points are unnecessary with closing Lawrence Street midway between Maddox and Harley Streets.

 Answer: WestConnex project has the potential to divert through traffic onto local streets. The closure of Lawrence Street, between Maddox and Harley Streets, will not prevent vehicles using Harley Street to access Lawrence and Belmont Streets and then onto Fountain Streets as a short -cut route. The single lane slow points will discourage this short-cut route and ensure lower speeds.

Comment: Similar street modifications in Mosman have negatively affected the amenity of the street such as parking loss and there are no issues with traffic flow in Belmont Street but parking will be removed with treatment.

Answer: The Belmont and Lawrence Streets single lane slow points will replace the
existing at-grade thresholds that already include kerb side islands and a median
midway along these streets. This will mean there should be no loss of kerbside parking
with this proposal.

Comment: Unnecessary, cost.

 Answer: The City supports improving safety and residential amenity for the community. These treatments were recommended to protect the residential area from the potential impacts from WestConnex and improve safety along with providing further landscaping to maintain residential amenity.

Comment: What is the benefit of single lane slow points?

• **Answer:** The single lane slow points will ensure lower speed, discourage by-pass traffic and provide open space.

Comment: Slow points will send additional traffic down Belmont and Lawrence Lanes as bypass the treatments. Existing speed humps do not reduce vehicle speeds and pedestrians walk on road, as footpaths are too narrow.

 Answer: The potential diversion of traffic to Belmont and Lawrence Lanes as by-pass has been identified and both laneways will be monitored by the City to determine if further action is necessary.

Comment: Concern slow points will bank up vehicles outside our door while waiting to use single lane. Already issue with taxis, Uber, council trucks etc that temporarily stop or park outside our driveways. Moved slow point outside Dan Murphy/Woolworths building where there are no households.

Answer: The slow point needs to be located approximately halfway between Harley
and Fountain Streets to provide the maximum benefit to slow traffic and ensure that if
any temporary queuing occurs then it does not affect safety near intersections.

Unfortunately, moving the slow point next to the Dan Murphy/Woolworths driveway would not be supported as it is too close to Fountain Street and would reduce the effectiveness of the treatment.

Comment: Parking in Lawrence Lane will this be stopped as it is a hazard for drivers in and out of Lawrence Lane.

 Answer: Lawrence and Belmont Lanes traffic and parking arrangements will be monitored to ensure safety and access is maintained. Generally, kerb side parking in the lanes can narrow the travel space and therefore slow down traffic. Providing a wide travel space in a laneway will increase speed and usage as a short-cut route. Removal of parking would only be considered if it affects access.

Comment: Slow points will make it more difficult for emergency vehicles to access our street.

• **Answer:** Emergency services will be advised of changes on Lawrence and Belmont Streets with new slow points.

Note that when Emergency Vehicles are under lights and sirens, all vehicles must move out of the way.

Comment: How does this slow point make pedestrians safer? Will NOT make it safer for cyclist!

• **Answer:** The single lane slow point will physically force vehicles to slow down and improve safety.

Comment: Where speed humps and a lower speed limit considered instead of slow point?

 Answer: The single lane slow points incorporates a speed hump/raised threshold in the design to physically reduce vehicle speed and forms part of the single lane treatment. Speed humps, without the slow point, have limited effectiveness with discouraging the use of the street by short-cut traffic.

TfNSW (formally RMS) are responsible to authorise speed limits and not the City of Sydney. However, Lawrence and Belmont Streets are already signposted as a 40km/h Local Traffic Area speed limit, which is appropriate for residential streets.


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

Schedule A On Street Event Conditions

- 1. The Applicant must carryout letterbox drops to all affected properties at least seven days prior to the start of road closures, and resolve any issues that may arise and all representations made by the affected properties.
- 2. The Applicant must provide a telephone number of the supervisor responsible for the proposed event and include these contact details in the notification letters to affected properties.
- 3. All costs associated with the event are to be borne by the Applicant.
- 4. The Applicant shall indemnify and keep indemnified The City of Sydney against all claims, demands, suits, actions, damages and costs incurred by or charges made against The City of Sydney in respect to death or injury to any person or damage in any way arising from this event.
- 5. The Applicant will be required to reimburse The City of Sydney for the cost of repair of any damage caused to the public way as a result of the activities associated with this event.
- 6. A public liability insurance policy for an amount not less than \$20,000,000 for any one occurrence must be held in joint names including The City of Sydney as an interested party the Applicant of this event must inform its liability insurers of the terms of this Condition.
- 7. The Applicant must close roads in accordance with Roads and Maritime Services (RMS)
 Traffic Control at Worksites Manual (AS1742.3) and the approved Traffic Management Plan
 unless otherwise directed by Police, RMS or authorised City officers.
- 8. The Applicant must at all times provide a 4-metre wide emergency lane along the road to be closed.
- 9. The Applicant must not occupy the road or footway until the road closure and associated Traffic Management Plan has been implemented.
- 10. The Applicant must use RMS Accredited Traffic Controllers to manage pedestrian and traffic safety during the event.
- 11. Where possible local access to properties shall be provided and an Accredited Traffic Controller be provided to manage the traffic ingress and egress at the location to ensure pedestrian and traffic safety.
- 12. The Applicant must notify emergency services (namely NSW Police Service, Fire and Rescue and NSW Ambulance Service) of the proposed temporary road closure at least seven days prior to the event.
- 13. The Applicant must remove all barriers and signs associated with the road closure at the times nominated to reopen the street to traffic.
- 14. The Applicant must place an advertisement in a Sydney metropolitan newspaper at least seven days before the closure.
- 15. The Applicant must contact the Transport Management Centre to confirm if a Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) is required.
- 16. The Applicant must where practical make alternate parking arrangements for affected properties during the event.

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- 17. The Applicant must advise car share operators of the approved closure seven days before the road is closed if a car share vehicle parking bay is located in the street.
- 18. The City reserves the right to revoke this road closure approval at any time without any compensation to the Applicant.

Schedule B Temporary Road Closure Conditions

The Applicant and their representatives:

- Must carry out letterbox drops to affected tenants, occupants, building managements and emergency services at least 14 days prior to the commencement of the road closure and include contact details for the supervisor. The Applicant must resolve, to the satisfaction of the City, any issues that may arise and all representations made by affected tenants and occupants.
- 2. The Applicant must provide local access, where practical, for nearby affected properties.
- 3. Roads must be closed in accordance with AS1742.3 and the approved Traffic Management Plan, unless otherwise directed by Police or authorised City officers.
- 4. Before the road closure is implemented the Applicant **MUST** contact the City's Construction Regulations Unit on 9265 9333 to obtain the relevant permits.
- 5. Must not occupy the carriageway or footway of the road until the road closure has been implemented.
- 6. Must at all times provide a 4-metre wide emergency lane along the closed road. If the emergency lane cannot be provided, then the Applicant must discuss it with Emergency Services (namely Police, Fire Brigade and NSW Ambulance) and provide an alternative emergency access arrangement to their satisfaction. All services (fire hydrants etc) must be kept free of any obstructions.
- 7. Must provide and maintain appropriate and adequate traffic measures (including detour signs and flagmen) for the safe movement of traffic and pedestrians.
- 8. Must remove all barriers and signs associated with the road closure at the times nominated to reopen the road to traffic.
- 9. Must indemnify the City against all claims for damage or injury that may result from the activity or occupation of part of the road or footpath during the activity. The applicant must provide documentary evidence of public liability insurance indemnifying Council for a minimum of \$20,000,000
- 10. Must reimburse the City for the cost of repair to any damage caused to the road or footpath as a result of the Applicant carrying out their activities
- 11. Must comply with any reasonable directive of the City Rangers, Police or Roads and Maritime Services.
- 12. Must comply with the City's Code of Practice for Construction Hours and Noise within the City Centre.
- 13. Must place an advertisement in a Sydney metropolitan newspaper at least 7 days before the road closure.
- 14. Must meet all costs associated with the closure and shall pay all fees in accordance with the Council's current Fees and Charges.
- 15. The Applicant is to obtain a Road Occupancy Licence from the Transport Management Centre prior to commencement of works.

- 16. The Applicant must contact the Sydney Coordination Office to discuss the event and its impacts on works associated with the CBD and South East Light Rail (CSELR) project or other major works in the CBD
- 17. Must ensure a suitable Occupational Health & Safety Plan is in place for all personnel working at the site.
- 18. Any variation on the approved date and conditions will require the Applicant to submit a Deferred Date Application for consideration
- 19. Note that in the event of a traffic incident or emergency, the Police will take control of all traffic and pedestrian arrangements.
- 20. Must advise car share operators of the approved closure 14 days before the road is closed if a car share parking bay is located in the street.
- 21. Failure to comply with these Conditions may result in the approval being revoked and not reinstated.

Schedule C Works Zone Conditions

- 1. The applicant must notify adjacent properties of the Works Zone at least 14 days before the installation of the Works Zone and include contact details for the supervisor responsible for the Works Zone. A copy of the notification letter and distribution map must be provided to the City.
- 2. The applicant must pay all fees associated with the Works Zone.
- 3. The applicant must maintain public liability insurance for at least \$20 million during the period of use of the Works Zone. Evidence of this insurance must be provided to the City and the Applicant must:
 - 3.1. effect the insurance policies with an insurer approved by us;
 - 3.2. effect the insurance policies showing the City of Sydney as an interested party; and
 - 3.3. produce to us a Certificate of Currency for the public liability insurance policy
- 4. The applicant must comply with all relevant legislation, including Rule 181 of the New South Wales Road Rules 2014. The Works Zone is not to be used for commuting or private kerbside parking by builders, tradesperson or visitors to the site.
- 5. It is an offence under Section 667 of the Local Government Act 1993 to willfully remove, destroy, deface, damage or otherwise interfere with notices or signs erected by the City. The applicant must immediately notify the City's Traffic Works Coordinator of any lost or damaged signs adjoining the building site.
- 6. The applicant must provide safe pedestrian access adjacent to the Works Zone during the hours of operation. All traffic and pedestrian control must be in accordance with the current version of AS1742.3 and its associated handbook and RMS' Traffic Control at Work Sites Manual.
- 7. The City may require the applicant to enter into a separate deed if pedestrian access through private land is required.
- 8. The Applicant must give the City at least 2 weeks written notice if it wishes to suspend the Works Zone. Suspension of a Works Zone is at the City's discretion. The minimum suspension period is two weeks.
- 9. The Applicant must give the City at least 2 weeks written notice if the Works Zone is no longer required. The applicant must notify the City's Traffic Works Coordinator on ccalabro@cityofsydney.nsw.gov.au for the Works Zone to be removed.
- 10. The Applicant must continue to pay the Kerbside Usage Fees until the Works Zone is completely removed.
- 11. Works for major transport projects, such as the Sydney Light Rail Project and the Sydney City Centre Access Strategy, are currently being undertaken in the City's Local Government Area and have priority access and use rights over City owned or controlled land including roads and footpaths. The City may at any time, and with at least 1 business days' notice to the applicant, suspend or restrict the Works Zone if the Works Zone:
 - is required for a major transport project; or
 - is impracticable due to changes arising from a major transport project, such as traffic diversions; or
 - is otherwise unsuitable due to a major transport project.

The applicant must make its own enquiries, on a regular basis, about the potential impact of major transport projects on the Works Zone and the construction program for its development site.

12. The City may offset any fees owing by the applicant against the Deposit. The balance of the Deposit will be returned to the applicant when the Works Zone has been removed, all damages are rectified and all outstanding fees are paid in full.

- 13. The City may suspend or restrict the operation of a Works Zone for major events. Special traffic arrangements may be required during the Christmas and New Year period (generally from 1 December to 2 January) and other major event days. The applicant must make its own enquiries, on a regular basis, about any major events near their development site.
- 14. The applicant uses the Works Zone at its own risk. The City is not responsible for any loss, damage, injury or death relating to the applicant's use of the Works Zone. The applicant releases the City from and indemnifies and keeps the City indemnified against all liability, claims, action or demand associated with the Works Zone.
- 15. The Applicant shall indemnify and keep indemnified The City of Sydney against all loss (including financial loss), damage, expenses, claims, and liability suffered or incurred by us or our employees, consultants, agents, arising from the Applicant's activities including:
 - 15.1. Loss of or damage to our property and any other property; and
 - 15.2. Damage, expense, loss or liability for personal injury
- 16. The City is not responsible if the applicant is not able to gain access to the Works Zone.
- 17. Failure to comply with these Conditions may result in the Works Zone being revoked and not reinstated.
