Rawson Square, Haymarket Light Rail Interchange

Councillor Chan requested Transport to investigate improvements to coordinate timetables at the bus stop in Rawson Place and Haymarket Light Rail Stop.

Transport advised that a number of bus services frequently stop at the bus stop in Rawson Place and as such customers don't need to wait long for buses to arrive.
