

**Item 26.****Parking - No Parking - Kepos Lane, Redfern**

**Recommendations**

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the reallocation of parking on the western side of Kepos Lane, Redfern, as follows:

- (A) Between the points 10 metres and 117.4 metres (20 car spaces) north of Phillip Street, as "No Parking 6am-10am Mon Only" and "2P 10am-6pm Mon, 8am-6pm Tues-Fri, Permit Holders Excepted Area 41"; and
- (B) Between the points 53 metres and 60.8 metres (one car space), 72.5 metres and 81.3 metres (one car space), and 93.8 metres and 105.8 metres (two car spaces) north of Zamia Street, as "No Parking 6am-10am Mon Only".

## Background

Kepos Lane, Redfern, between Phillip and Telopea Streets, is a narrow laneway (approximately 4.4 metres wide) that facilitates waste collection for properties fronting Kepos and Baptist Streets.

Under existing conditions, the City's cleansing vehicles are unable to safely access the laneway for waste collection. To improve access to the laneway, it is proposed to introduce "No Parking" restrictions on the western side of Kepos Lane during waste collection periods.

## Comments

The kerb space on the western side of Kepos Lane, Redfern between Phillip and Zamia Streets, where the changes are proposed, is currently signposted as "2P 8am-6pm Mon-Fri, Permit Holders Excepted Area 41".

Additionally, the kerb space on the western side of Kepos Lane, between Zamia and Telopea Streets, where the changes are proposed, is currently unrestricted for parking.

On-site inspection shows there is a need to provide "No Parking" restrictions during waste collection periods to ensure that cleansing vehicles can operate in a safe and efficient manner.

Therefore, it is proposed to introduce "No Parking 6am-10am Mon Only" on the western side of Kepos Lane, between Phillip and Telopea Streets. Outside these hours, the kerb space will revert to the existing parking restrictions.

## Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 252 letters sent out with four responses supporting the proposal and two responses opposing the proposal.

Responses opposing the proposal were concerned about the impact on the demand for parking within the area.

## Financial

Funds are available in the current budget.
