

Item 37.**Traffic Treatment - Raised Median - Morehead Street, Redfern**

Background

The City's Sustainable Sydney 2030 vision includes commitments to increase tree canopy cover by 50% by 2030, to green our City and improve the amenity of our streets. In 2011,

Council adopted the City's Street Tree Master Plan which identifies a range of in-road tree planting sites such as Morehead Street, Redfern.

A raised median on Morehead Street will present a valuable opportunity to increase tree canopy in the street as well as increasing safety by reducing vehicle speeds.

Comments

Morehead Street is a 12.8 metre wide road with one traffic lane and one parking lane in each direction. The street provides local access through Redfern and Waterloo and currently does not service any bus routes. Therefore a raised median with in-road tree planting can be provided without impacting sightlines or traffic flow.

This proposal would help to improve general safety in the area by reducing the speed of traffic travelling along Morehead Street, by narrowing traffic lanes. This measure is part of the City's commitment to calm traffic and improve residential amenity.

The raised medians in Morehead Street will provide spaces for the planting of seven trees which will provide shade to cool the street, improve the amenity in the street and contribute towards the City's Sustainable Sydney targets. The proposal will not impact existing turning paths or sightlines for vehicles.

In July 2018, the Committee endorsed a raised median with tree planting directly to the south of this location. This proposed median will align with the recently approved median and has received in-principle approval from the RMS.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 535 letters sent out with eight responses supporting the proposal and no response opposing the proposal.

Submissions supporting the proposal noted that the proposal would reduce the speed of vehicles and improve amenity in the street.

Financial

Funds are available in the capital works budget for the In-Road Tree Planting Program.
