**Recommendations**

- (B) Between the points 16 metres and 22.1 metres (one car space) north of Renwick Street, as “2P 8am-6pm Mon-Fri, Permit Holder Excepted Area 36”.

## **Background**

A resident of Alexander Street, Alexandria has requested the provision of a set down area for emergency vehicles adjacent to the entrance of the United Church Apartments at the corner of Renwick Street.

## **Comments**

The kerb space on the western side of Alexander Street, Alexandria, north of Renwick Street, where the changes are proposed, is currently unrestricted for parking. The remainder of the kerb space in the street is “2P 8am-6pm Mon-Fri, Permit Holders Excepted”.

It is proposed to install one “No Parking” space to allow pick-up and drop-off operations for emergency vehicles and the general public, outside the front entrance of the Uniting Church Apartments.

Converting the remaining unrestricted kerb space to “2P 8am-6pm Mon-Fri, Permit Holder Excepted 36” will match the restrictions in the adjacent area, increase parking turnover and deter long-stay commuter parking.

## **Consultation**

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 98 letters sent out with one response supporting the proposal and no responses opposing the proposal.

## **Financial**

Funds are available in the current budget.
