

Item 22.**Parking - Loading Zone, Ticket Parking and No Stopping Police Vehicles Excepted - Sussex Street, Sydney**

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the following reallocation of parking on the western side of Sussex Street, Sydney, north of James Street as:

(A) “No Stopping Police Vehicles Excepted” between the points 10 metres and 25 metres (two car spaces); and

(B) “Loading Zone Ticket 7am-6pm Mon-Fri 7-11am Sat, Sun and Public Holidays” and “4P Ticket 6-10pm Mon-Fri 11am-10pm Sat, Sun and Public Holidays” between the point 25 metres and 73.2 metres (eight car spaces).

Background

Condition 18 of D/2017/188 for the approved redevelopment of 319-325 Sussex Street, Sydney, requires the developer to make a submission to the Committee to change on-street parking.

Comments

Parking outside 311 to 325 Sussex Street is a mix of Loading Zone Ticket/4P Ticket, 2P Ticket/4P Ticket and Works Zone/4P Ticket.

To improve access to on-street parking for delivery vehicles and drivers picking up and dropping off, it is proposed to rationalise parking as “Loading Zone Ticket 7am-6pm Mon-Fri 7-11am Sat, Sun & Public Holidays” and “4P Ticket 6-10pm Mon-Fri 11am-10pm Sat, Sun & Public Holidays” once the Works Zone is removed.

To improve access to on-street parking for NSW Police, the City is also proposing to change the existing “No Parking Police Vehicles Excepted” restriction outside 327-331 Sussex Street to “No Stopping Police Vehicles Excepted”. I enclose a sketch showing the proposed changes.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 1,555 letters sent out with one response supporting the proposal and no responses opposing the proposal.

Financial

Funds are available in the current budget.
