From 17 May to 14 June 2019, we asked the community for feedback on a concept design for a plan to improve Clyne Reserve, Millers Point. We received 9 submissions during the public exhibition period. A summary of the feedback received is provided below.



Play equipment	More challenging play elements for children 6-12 years old. Elements that encourage climbing e.g. monkey bars, climbing walls and fireman poles	1	This will be considered during design development phase.
	A water play element with vertical water spray jets	1	Not proposed as part of the scope of works.
	Retain 'boat' element	2	To be reviewed as part of the design development phase.
	Nautical theme should remain for play equipment	2	The proposed play equipment has been designed to be simple and robust in a landscape setting.
	Would like more natural materials incorporated into play area	1	The proposed design includes a nature play area with reclaimed boulders and steppers. The nature play areas has been located adjacent to open grass to allow for imaginative play throughout the reserve.

<b>Planting</b>	Do not remove any trees	1	There are no trees being removed as part of this park upgrade.
	Native planting in the area between the Barangaroo wire fence and Clyne Reserve	1	Not proposed as part of this scope of works. All feedback received outside the project scope has been passed to the relevant teams for consideration.
	Would like to see the continuation of the native species planting that is currently at Clyne Reserve	1	Additional native and habitat planting is proposed.
<b>Other</b>	Lower area of the park to become fenced and become off leash dog area	3	The City's parks provide for the recreational needs of all the community. We aim to provide an equitable mix of locally accessible off-leash and on-leash parks for the benefit of dog owners and those who not welcome close interaction with off-leash dogs. There are 48 off-leash parks within the City of Sydney area. Just two are entirely enclosed with fencing – Embarkation Park, Potts Point; and Hugo St Reserve, Redfern. The City's preference is for off-leash recreation to be integrated with other recreation activities within a park rather than segregated areas for the exclusive use of dog owners.
	Install bins that have larger openings for bigger pieces of rubbish	1	As part of this upgrade an additional bin will be installed.  All park furniture will be City of Sydney standard.
<b>Outside of scope issues</b>	Clean up and maintain the sandstone wall in Rhoden Lane	1	Not proposed as part of this scope of works

## Online feedback form - rating elements of the proposed upgrade


Respondents who completed the online feedback form were asked to rate how important elements of the proposed design were to them. The results are below.
