Background

The development of 5 Hudson Street, Redfern (D/2014/446) requires that the Applicant submits a signage plan for kerbside parking arrangements along the site's frontage in Hudson Street, to be referred to the Local Pedestrian, Cycling and Traffic Calming Committee.

Comments

The kerb space on the southern side of Hudson Street, Redfern, east of Evans Lane, where the changes are proposed, is currently unrestricted for parking.

It is proposed to install parking restrictions to reflect the change in adjacent land use. As such, it is proposed to install "2P 8am-10pm" along the frontage of the redevelopment site in Hudson Street. The hours of restricted parking are consistent with those in nearby Hugo and Vines Streets.

Under the NSW Road Rules 2014, a driver must not stop on a road within 10 metres from an intersection without traffic lights. Parking at intersections can obstruct driver vision and cause unsafe conditions especially for pedestrians crossing the road. A yellow edge pavement marking will therefore be installed to clarify the statutory "No Stopping" restriction at the intersection of Hudson Street and Evans Lane.

Consultation

The Applicant must notify adjacent properties at least seven days prior to the implementation of the changes.

Financial

All costs associated with the parking changes will be borne by the applicant.
