

Item 25.**Parking - Permit Parking - Tosh Lane, Zetland**

Recommendations

It is recommended that the Committee endorse the reallocation of parking on Tosh Lane, Zetland as follows:

- (A) On the southern side of Tosh Lane, between the points 7 metres and 13 metres (one car space) west of Paul Street, as “2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Excepted Area 35”;
- (B) on the southern side of Tosh Lane, between the points 48 metres and 89 metres (7 car spaces) west of Paul Street, as “2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Excepted Area 35”;
- (C) on the eastern side of Emanuel Lane, between the points 10 metres and 28 metres (three car spaces) north of Hansard Street, as “2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Excepted Area 35”.

Background

Residents have requested a review of parking restrictions in Portman Street, Hansard Street, Merton Street, Tosh Lane, Christies Lane and Portman Lane to clarify and reduce restrictions on parking controls. The requests include clarifying restrictions and signage in laneways.

Comments

Tosh Lane and Emanuel Lane, Zetland are narrow lanes with a number of driveways which provide rear access to properties along Hansard Street.

Currently parts of the lanes are unrestricted however there are locations between driveways which do not impact access and could therefore be allocated "2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Exceeded Area 35". This additional restriction would assist residents to find parking near their homes without impacting access .

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area between 20 May 2021 to 10 June 2021. A Sydney Your Say webpage and interactive map were created as part of the consultation. 240 letters were distributed, an email was sent to 305 stakeholders and an online community briefing was held on 31 May 2021. The following pieces of feedback were received:

- (i) 32 email submissions
- (ii) 195 pieces of feedback were received from 29 people on interactive map
- (iii) 2 petitions regarding parking on Hansard Street

The changes to Tosh and Emanuel Lane was generally supported by the residents during the consultation.

Financial

Funds are available in the current budget for Green Square Town Centre Infrastructure works.
