Background

Place Management NSW (PMNSW) has applied for the temporary road closures in The Rocks for the St Patrick's Day Parade 2022 on Sunday 20 March 2022 from 10am to 7pm.

Comments

The parade will assemble at Dawes Point Park and move down George Street in stages to its official start point on George Street where it meets Hickson Road at 10:30am. The parade will make its way South on George Street towards the Cahill Expressway at Circular Quay. Just before Alfred Street (under the Cahill Expressway) the parade will turn left through the fence to its official end at First Fleet Park at approximately 11:00am.

Viewing point will run the route of George Street on either side of crowd control barriers which will be on the boundary of the two active road lanes on George Street. No vehicles will be included in the parade with walking participants only.

The parade route, with an expected 500 participants (max 1,400 with onlookers) will be using the roadway on George Street with road closures in place to support the activities.

The Sydney St Patrick's Day Organisation is a not-for-profit organisation and volunteer group that organises the annual St Patrick's Day event and parade in the Sydney CBD (usually held on the 3rd Sunday of March). It is the largest St Patrick's Day event in the Southern Hemisphere

Consultation

Place Management NSW will consult and notify adjacent properties and businesses, Port Authority, Car Parks, Four Seasons Hotel, residents and stakeholders of the intention to implement the temporary road closures. Enquiries and feedback from stakeholders directed to Adam Shumack the Senior Manager, Retail Activation & Customer Experience, Place Management NSW.

PMNSW continue to work closely with NSW Police, TfNSW, and City of Sydney on precinct activations, updates or changes.

Financial

All costs associated with the parking spaces, signs, SEC's, traffic controllers, Rangers, road barriers, HVM and accessible ramps has and will be borne by PMNSW.
