



### EXISTING STREET CHARACTER


To the east is the 'Sydneygate' former industrial lands which has been redeveloped into mixed-use precinct over the last decade. To the north of the site is the danks street south mixed-use urban renewal precinct set within the former Sydney water site and surrounding former light industrial precinct to the north and north-west. To the south and south-west of the site are 1-2 storey light industrial and retail showroom premises along Young St and Powell St, within older brick and masonary built form.

The street tree character along Young and McEvoy street is primarily Australian native Eucalyptus and Corymbia which create a lush green street environment. The street character along Bourke street is a combination of native and exotics which creates a strong canopy coverage for the street.


# **PODIUM/ROOFTOP PLAN**



## PLANTING STRATEGY

The site is located on the Botany aquifer, an ancient sand basin featuring open heathland vegetation, ridges, lagoons and soaks. Nearby landscapes include, banksia scrub on headlands and temperate rainforest gullies.

This landscape is the home of the Dharawal people, the traditional custodians who understood their land in six seasons each representing spatial variations, materials and landscape – the flow of plant and animal resources on which they relied.


