## **Background**

Australia Post has requested the consideration of parking in Scott Street, Pyrmont to service a mailbox in Harris Street. The proposed location currently has no legal stopping locations for Australia Post vehicles to service their mailbox.

### Comments

There is currently one Australia Post mailbox located outside 52 Harris Street, Pyrmont, just west of Scott Street. Parking adjacent to the proposed location is currently signposted as "No Stopping" and "1P Ticket Permit Holders Excepted Area 20".

To allow Australia Post staff to service the mail box, it is proposed to reallocate part of the existing "No Stopping" and a section of the "1P Ticket Permit Holders Excepted Area 20" parking restrictions to "No Stopping Australia Post Vehicles Excepted 3 min Limit 8am-6pm Mon-Fri" and "1P Ticket All Other Times Permit Holders Excepted Area 20".

Australia Post has been consulted on the proposal and raised no objections.

### Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 298 letters sent out with no responses supporting or opposing the proposal.
