Background

Residents of Jones Bay Road have requested consideration to change parking along side the driveway leading to The Star's porte cochere to deter illegal parking and improve access for taxis in the vicinity of the driveway.

Comments

The kerb space on the southern side of Jones Bay Road, Pyrmont between Pyrmont Street and Pirrama Road where the changes are proposed, is currently signposted as "No Parking".

On-site inspection shows that taxi drivers often park in the "No Parking" zone whilst waiting to enter the porte cochere. These parked taxis impede access to the porte cochere. As such, it is proposed to reallocate parking to "No Stopping" to prevent parking and install chevron line markings to highlight the "No Stopping" zone.

Consultation

The City consulted local residents and businesses in the area. There were 424 letters sent out with 14 responses supporting the proposal and one response opposing the proposal.

The opposing submission is concern about the loss of "No Parking" spaces to pick up and drop off goods and passengers.

There is a "No Parking" zone on the western side of Jones Bay Road, south of Pirrama Road available for drivers to pick up and drop off goods and passengers.

The City discussed the proposal with The Star and NSW Taxi Council, who have raised no objections.
