Background

- 1. The total stated value of all development applications currently under assessment is \$2.4 billion.
- 2. There are 292 development applications outstanding to be determined under delegation or to be referred to Local Planning Panel with a total value of \$1 billion with an average of 75 net days from time of lodgement.
- 3. As at 1 July 2024, there are currently nine Development Applications and two modification applications to be considered by the Central Sydney Planning Committee (CSPC) with a value of \$1.4 billion with an average of 114 net days from time of lodgement.
- 4. A further 209 development related applications are also under assessment including applications to modify or review a determination, subdivision certificates, heritage works and footway applications.
- 5. The applications to be reported to the CSPC are detailed in Attachment A.
- 6. Trend graphs showing numbers and value of applications as well as the average outstanding days of development applications to be considered by the CSPC at end of each quarter are provided in Attachment B. The graphs represent the period from first quarter of 2022/23 to the fourth quarter of 2023/24.
- 7. There is one development application previously reported as requiring determination by the CSPC which is subject to an appeal.
