### Background

Placemaking NSW has received a request from the Pymont local residents Action Group to add traffic calming measures on Darling Island Pymont. These changes will include, where practical, the introduction of speed cushions along three sections of Darling Island Road.

**Comments**

Place Management NSW seek endorsement for the installation of three speed Cushions in accordance with Australian Standards through AS2890.1: 2004. These speed Cushions will be spaced approximately 50m apart along Darling Island Road.

Installing speed cushions in Darling Island will also significantly enhances safety by slowing down traffic, reducing the likelihood and severity of accidents, and improving pedestrian safety. These speed cushions will also serve as a traffic-calming measure, discouraging cut-through traffic and encouraging drivers to adhere to speed limits. This initiative will make Darling Island more pedestrian- and cyclist-friendly and contribute to a much safer environment.

**Consultation**

Placemaking NSW has consulted with the Pyrmont Action Group and Darling Island Strata Committee members to gain their endorsement for the proposed changes. The community has shown overwhelming support for the effective implementation of speed reduction measures on residential streets across Darling Island.

**Financial**

All costs associated with the speed cushions installation will be borne by Place Management NSW.
