**Executive Summary**

Council received correspondence from the Commissioner of Fire and Rescue NSW (FRNSW) in relation to the subject premises on 20 December 2024 with respect to matters of fire safety.

The premises consists of a seven-storey residential apartment building.

The City inspected the premises on 27 February 2025, accompanied by the building manager. The inspection identified fire safety provisions requiring maintenance, which can be addressed under the City's instruction.

The inspection also noted the presence of potentially combustible external wall cladding. As the premises was a Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority (SHFA) approval (DA 90-12-98), the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment has jurisdiction over any cladding investigation or remediation on this premises. On 16 November 2020, SHFA confirmed they will investigate and take enforcement action as required.

On 28 June 2021, the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment issued an order for the removal and replacement of the cladding. On 9 April 2025, they informed the City that the onsite works were completed in December 2024, and the final certification is currently under review.

12 March 2025	The City reinspected the premises in the presence of the building manager and observed the current AFSS prominently displayed in the building as required.



## Fire and Rescue NSW Report

FRNSW conducted an inspection of the subject premises on 18 December 2024 in response to the Project Remediate programme being undertaken by the NSW Department of Customer Service, to remove high risk combustible cladding on residential apartment buildings in NSW.

In response to the Project Remediate programme being undertaken by the NSW Department of Customer Service, to remove high-risk combustible cladding on residential apartment buildings in NSW, an inspection of 'the premises' on 18 December 2024 was conducted by Authorised Fire Officers from the Fire Safety Compliance Unit of Fire and Rescue NSW (FRNSW), pursuant to the provisions of Section 9.32(1)(b) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act).

On behalf of the Commissioner of FRNSW, the comments in this report are provided under Section 9.32(4). The items listed in the comments of this report are based on the following limitations:

- A general overview of the building was obtained without using the development consent conditions or approved floor plans as reference.
- Details of the Provisions for Fire Safety and Fire Fighting Equipment are limited to a visual inspection of the parts in the building accessed and the fire safety measures observed at the time.
